



Site Regulations

for the event location of the BMW International Open 2024

§ 1 Stay

1. Visitors shall hereby accept these Site Regulations when they enter the event venue.
2. Visitors may only stay on that part of the event site where they are authorized to do so.
3. Visitors shall have no right to enter the event venue.
4. The event area or event location comprises the golf course of Golfclub München Eichenried GmbH & Co. KG (the "original 18-hole course" of Eichenried, Driving Range, Pitching Area, Putting Greens, all practice areas such as 6-hole pitch and putt course, tee house, defined areas in the Clubhouse as well as all parking lots, paths and areas between the Fairways and to the other Buildings located on the 18-hole site) and temporary structures which will be set up to the tournament.

§ 2 Security Check

1. With the consent of the person concerned, the security service commissioned by the organiser in the event area is entitled to search containers (bags, rucksacks, etc.) or items of clothing carried by the visitor for prohibited items and to seize these items. If the visitor refuses to be searched, he/she may be banned from the premises. The organiser and the security service reserve the right to call in the police.

§ 3 Conduct in the event area

1. Every visitor shall behave in the event area in such a way that nobody else is injured, endangered or - more than is unavoidable under the circumstances - hindered or burdened.
2. Visitors shall comply with the instructions of the security staff, the organizer's employees, other persons commissioned by the organizer, the police, fire brigade and the emergency and medical service. This provision shall also apply to instructions which are announced via loudspeakers and other media.
3. The site may only be entered and exited via the entrances and exits intended for this purpose.
4. All entrances to the site shall be kept free. Irrespective of these Site Regulations, any other necessary instructions may be issued in an individual case to prevent or eliminate danger to life, health or property. Visitors shall follow the instructions issued by the police or the security staff for this purpose.
5. Every person entering the site shall be requested not to throw away rubbish, packaging materials and empty containers, but to dispose of them in the rubbish bins on the site.
6. Cellphones and other acoustic devices must be switched to silent mode on the golf course. Audio, film and video recordings are not permitted.



§ 4 Prohibitions

1. Visitors shall not be permitted to carry the following items:
 - 1.1. Weapons within the meaning of the Weapons Act;
 - 1.2. Objects and items which may be used as weapons, blunt weapons, sharp weapons, thrust weapons or missiles;
 - 1.3. Items which may be perceived as a weapon, e.g. toy weapons, dummy weapons or weapons that do not work;
 - 1.4. Fireworks, flares, smoke powder, smoke bombs or other pyrotechnical items;
 - 1.5. In areas with large crowds or in other areas designated by the organizer: bottles, beakers, jugs, cans or other items which are made of glass or another fragile, splintering or very hard material
 - 1.6. Alcoholic drinks brought along by the visitors;
 - 1.7. Drugs and stimulants (the consumption of cannabis, marijuana, hashish or similar narcotics is prohibited on the event site.)
 - 1.8. Racist, xenophobic, unconstitutional, sexist or political propaganda material;
 - 1.9. Any advertising, commercial, political or religious items, including banners, signs, symbols and leaflets and similar, as well as any kinds of advertising and commercial objects and materials if they are not approved by the organizer
 - 1.10. Gas spray cans, caustic, combustible, colouring or other dangerous substances or containers holding substances which endanger health or are highly flammable, except commercial pocket lighters or these are labelled with the german hazard symbols E, F+, F (explosion hazard, highly flammable, highly flammable). Exceptions apply to commercially available lighters, deodorant sprays and other cosmetic articles.
 - 1.11. Bulky items such as ladders, crates, very large bags, suitcases;
 - 1.12. Laser pointers;
 - 1.13. Drones and other remote-control flying objects;
 - 1.14. Other objects which may endanger the security of the event
 - 1.15. Dogs may not be brought to the event venue.
 - 1.16. tape recorders, film and video cameras
2. **Other prohibitions:**
 - 2.1. Visitors shall not be entitled to enter areas and rooms which are clearly not designated for general use (e.g. fairways, work and security areas, players' areas);
 - 2.2. Visitors shall not damage, mark, paint or affix stickers to structural installations, facilities or paths or deface them in any other way; visitors shall not be permitted to throw any kinds of objects or spill liquids, especially in the direction of persons. Climbing on or over buildings or parts of facilities that are recognisably not intended for general use, in particular facades, fences, walls, enclosures of event areas and other boundaries, in particular barriers, lighting systems, trees, as well as sales facilities and vehicles.



§ 5 Infringements

1. Persons who contravene the Site Regulations or do not observe the instructions and orders of the security staff, the organizer's employees, other persons appointed by the organizer, the police, fire brigade and the emergency and medical services, or who are obviously under the influence of toxic substances, may be prevented from entering the event area or ejected therefrom by the security staff and the police. The organizer and the security staff shall reserve the right in these cases to file a criminal complaint due to trespass.
2. If visitors ignore the instructions of the security service or the loudspeaker announcements (e.g. in the event of an evacuation due to thunderstorms with lightning strikes), the organizer is no longer responsible and liable for the safety of the respective visitors.
3. In the event of serious or repeated infringements, the person concerned may be banned from the event for its remaining duration.

§ 6 Liability

1. Anyone entering the tournament grounds and watching the event do so at their own risk. In particular, the organizer will not be liable for damage caused by stray golf balls of a player.
2. The holder of the admission ticket hereby agrees without payment or time restriction that video and audio recordings may be made of him/her and transmitted in audiovisual media during the event.
3. The organizer will only be liable for material damage and physical injury if it is based on gross negligence or intent.
4. The organizer shall only be liable in the case of intent or gross negligence for damage caused by the infringement of contractual or non-contractual obligations, especially due to unauthorized action. The above-mentioned liability restriction shall not apply to loss of life, physical injury or damage to health.
5. The above-mentioned liability restriction shall apply to the same extent to the organizer's subcontractors and vicarious agents.
6. The above regulations shall not involve a change in the burden of proof to the disadvantage of the event visitor.
7. Injured or damaged persons shall contact the organizer immediately to report the injuries/damage.

§ 7 Final Provisions

1. These Site Regulations shall come into force at 7 am on 29 June 2024 and shall apply until 7 am on 08 July 2024.
2. The Site Regulations shall form an integral part of the authorization to access the tournament and shall be published as part of ticket purchase or confirmation of accreditation.
3. The provisions arising from the Parking Regulations shall apply in addition to the Site Regulations.
